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As a student, I agree with professor Genova's belief that is important to gain trust of students so that they engage with the material, feel comfortable asking questions, and come to appreciate the value of what they are learning.

In the case of Genova, he gave his trust to his students by not being too strict. He gives take home essays to his students with the same as the previous semester and found out that there seems to be uncanny similarity in the opinions that students express their opinions. So what he did is to run the papers in turnitin.com for him to know whether his thinking is right. And I think there is nothing wrong with what Genova did. He is not strict to his student and gives his trust to them that's why he has the right to know whether his students are honest or not. If the students will know that there is a way a professor can know whether they are plagiarizing or not, they will no longer copy other's work instead they will think on their own.
